* - Boaters navigating through Stump Pass and Gasparilla Pass should use extreme caution due to shifting channels and sand bars. Visitors should consult local knowledge before using these passes.

SHELLFISH HARVESTING

The harvesting of shellfish (clams, mussels, and oysters) is allowed in some areas of Lemon Bay, Charlotte Harbor, Gasparilla Sound, Pine Island Sound, and Matlacha Pass. To obtain maps showing allowable shellfish harvesting areas, visit floridaaquaculture.com or call 850-488-5471.

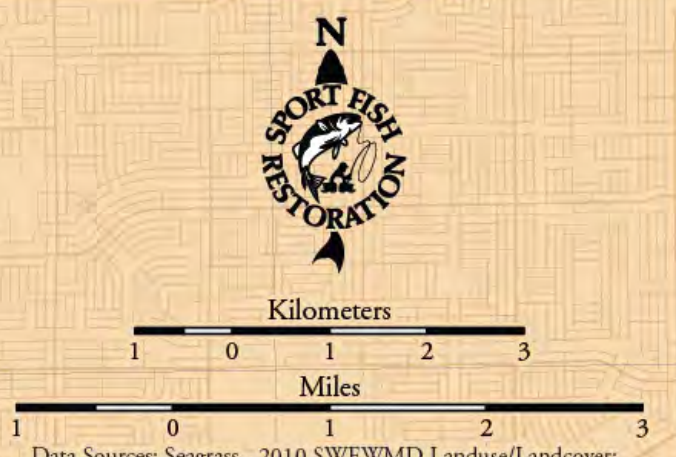
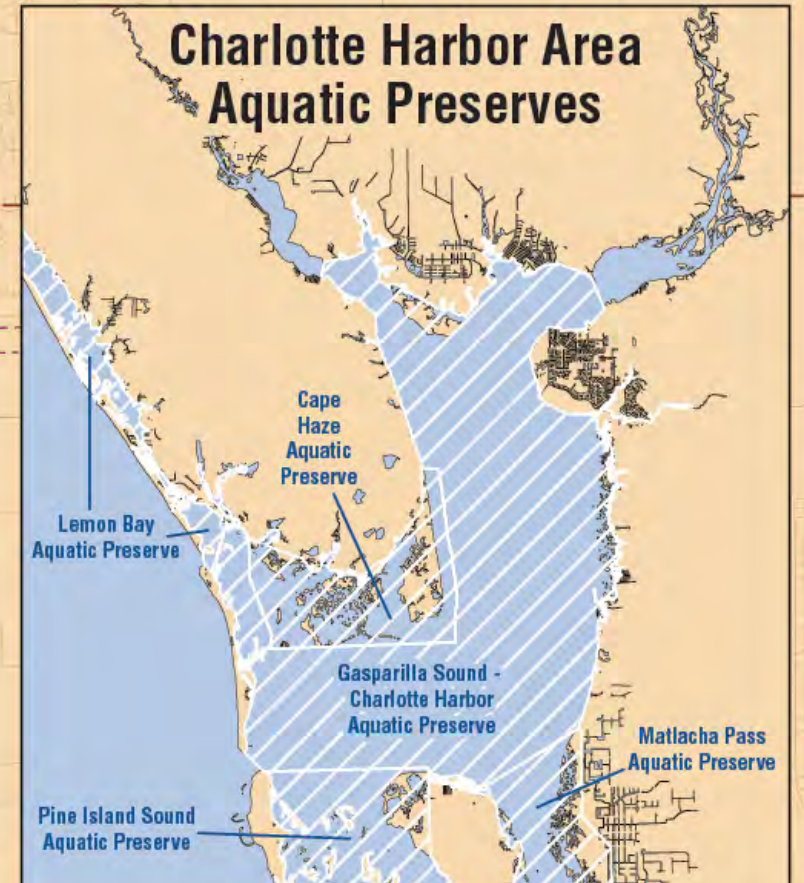
Aquaculture lease areas in Gasparilla Sound are privately operated clam rearing sites where anchoring is restricted and shellfish harvesting is prohibited except by lease holder. Please be on the lookout for dive flags that indicate a shellfish grower is underwater tending crops.

SHORELINE FISHING LICENSE

Florida residents fishing for saltwater species from the shore or from a structure fixed to shore are required to have a shoreline fishing license. The annual resident shoreline fishing license is now free. Those who obtain the license over the phone or from the internet will have to pay a convenience fee of less than \$5. Resident anglers may consider purchasing a \$17.00 one-year saltwater license which covers both shoreline and watercraft recreational fishing.

TARPON FISHING IN BOCA GRANDE PASS

During the months of April, May, and June, seasonal fishing regulations are in place for Boca Grande Pass (inside red boundary):

- A maximum of three fishing lines may be deployed from a vessel at any one time while fishing for all species.
- No person shall use, fish with, or place in the water any breakaway gear.

*Breakaway gear means any bob, float, weight, lure, or spoon that is affixed to a fishing line or hook with wire, line, rubber bands, plastic ties, or other fasteners designed to break off when a fish is caught.

DIVER DOWN FLAG

It is REQUIRED BY LAW to display this flag when divers are in the water. Boaters in the vicinity of a vessel displaying the diver down flag must give 100' clearance within rivers, inlets, or navigation channels or 300' clearance in all waterways other than rivers, inlets, or navigation channels. A flag displayed on a vessel must be 20" by 24" or larger. Flags attached to a buoy or float must be 12" by 12" or larger. A stiffener is also required to keep the flag unfurled.
